# **Instructions/Guidelines for Authors**

Please refer the latest guideline before sending the manuscript.

### **Submission process:**

Prepare as per our guidelines and send your articles in single MS WORD FILE to submit@globalresearchonline.net and submit\_ijpsrr@rediffmail.com

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- References should be formatted as follows: Vancouver citation style

Author (last name) AB (initials), Author BB, Title of Article, Journal name, year; volume(issue): page numbers, DOI: XXXXXXX: PMID: XXXXXXX.

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# Page format:

Prepare the manuscript in **Calibri font** using a **font size of 12**, with sufficient margins on all the sides. **Title** shall be in a **font size 14**, **bold face capitals**. All **section titles** in the manuscript shall be in **font size 12**, **bold face capitals**. **Subtitles** in each section shall be in **font size 12**, **bold face lower case**. Standard International Units could be used throughout the text. Pages should be numbered consecutively, manuscript should be starting with the title page indicating author details and the text should be arranged in the following order:

- 1. Title page, with names of Authors, affiliations/addresses, phone numbers, email ids and address for correspondence
- 2. ABSTRACT,
- 3. Keywords,
- 4. INTRODUCTION,
- 5. MATERIALS AND METHODS,
- 6. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION,
- 7. CONCLUSION
- 8. REFERENCES.

Tables and figures should be kept in their position in the article. Each table or figure should be presented with corresponding numbers. Tables and figures must be cited in the text in numerical order. Table 2 cannot be first cited before Table 1. If citation to a Table or Figure is not found in the text, the table or figure will be deleted. The total combined tables and figures should not be more than 10.

# 1. Title Page:

The title must be as brief as possible, comprehensive and descriptive. Each author must provide their full name including their forenames and surname followed by their address in normal face lower case. The Corresponding Author of the manuscript must be marked with an asterisk, and should be listed first. In addition, the corresponding author must include telephone (mobile number, for ready contact during peer review) and E-mail address at the bottom left corner of the title page. If any of the co-authors are from different organizations, their addresses too should be mentioned and indicated using numbers after their names.

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## 4. INTRODUCTION

Should start on a new page and should clearly indicate the aim of the study. It should include the introduction to the work presented.



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# 5. MATERIALS AND METHODS

The section should include concise details on the methodology adopted, sufficient to repeat the experiment. Extracts and/or fractions tested for *in vitro* or *in vivo* biological activities should be chemically defined, at least by means of the results of preliminary phytochemical screening. Complete formulation details of all crude drug mixtures and extracts should be mentioned. The plant name should be fully mentioned when cited first, and the authors are asked to add the details regarding its identification, voucher herbarium specimen number and name of the herbarium institution where it has been deposited. The statistical method and the level of significance chosen should be clearly stated.

### 6. RESULTS AND DISCUSSION

In this section all observations should be described neatly in text with indication of corresponding table or figure numbers. All results presented in tabular or graphical form shall be described in this section. All Tables and figures must have a title and a legend to make them self-explanatory and they should be given numbers.

### 7. CONCLUSION

Conclusions should contain a critical review of the results of the study OR with the support of relevant literature. It can end with brief conclusions.

#### 8. REFERENCES

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Please note, from January 2021 (Volume 66, Issue 1) on wards we are moving to follow Vancouver citation style for a broad indexing coverage and progressing for more standard presentation of our references.

Should be numbered consecutively in the order in which they are first mentioned in the text (not in alphabetic order). Identify references in text, tables, and legends by numerals in superscript (References should be referred to by number in superscript after the text).

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You are requested to include all the authors names, even though the number of authors are more.

**Example:** Sama V, Reddy YSR, Ramesh M, Swamy MM, Mahadevan N, Suresh B, Pharmacognostical studies on *Dodonaea viscosa* leaves, African Journal of Pharmacy and Pharmacology, 2008;11(2):83-88. doi: 10.1002/jmv.25725.

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And, as per some of the author's requests, we want to capture the photograph and short summary of the corresponding author in the published article. It is not compulsory and not part of our author's guideline, it is optional only. Authors (corresponding author) who interested to keep their photograph and short summary in their upcoming article, they can send their passport size colour photograph with good clarity (scan or image format) and their short summary to our mail id in word format along with your article to submit\_ijpsrr@rediffmail.com. The format for sending the short summary I have enclosed some examples below. You no need to match the words, but similarly you can write your summary in 3-6 lines, as per your wish. We will add this author short summary at the end of the article (last page).
